

Works Cited

MLA Format

Center the title, Works Cited, an inch from the top of the page.

Double-space between the title and first entry.

Begin each entry flush with the left margin and use a hanging indent or indent five spaces for additional lines in that entry.

Double-space the entire list.

If no author is given, start with the title.

Alphabetize entries in the list of works cited by author's last name or, if not given, by the title.

Use a period at the end of each entry.

Give dates as day month year.

If no sponsor or publisher is given use N.p.

If no date of publication or update is given use n.d.

Cite URLs only if instructed by teacher.

Magazine/Journal/Newspaper article from an online database subscription service

Author's last name, first name. "Title of article." Publication name (italicized). Publication date: Page number/range. Database name (italicized). Publication medium. Date accessed.

SIRS Researcher. Web. 10 Jan. 2010.

Section of a book from an online database subscription service

Author's last name, first name. "Title of section." Title of book (italicized). Ed. Editor's first name last name. Publisher, Date published. Database name (italicized). Publication medium. Date accessed.

Witkin, Gordon. "Hate Crimes: A Growing Threat." *Ethnic Violence*. Ed. Myra H. Immell. Greenhaven, 2000. *Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center*. Web. 14 May 2006.

Web Page

Author's last name, first name (if given). "Title of web page." Title of the overall website (italicized). Publisher or sponsor of the site (if not available, use N.p.), Date of publication (if not available, use n.d.). Publication medium. Date accessed.

"Fever." *MayoClinic.com*. Mayo Foundation for Medical Education, 6 June 2009. Web. 15 Jan. 2010.

"How to Make Vegetarian Chili." *eHow.com*. eHow, n.d. Web. 24 Feb. 2009.

E-mail

Author of the message last name, first name. "Title of message taken from the subject line." Message to name of the recipient. Date of the message. Publication medium.

Jones, Anthony. "Parent Surveys." Message to Jane Smith. 19 Jan. 2010. E-mail.

Blog/Wiki/Message Board

Author's name. "Posting title." Name of site (italicized). Sponsor or publisher of site, Posting date. Medium. Date accessed.

Miller, Chris. "More polls." *Both Sides of the Ball*. JDNEWS.com, 12 Jan. 2009. Web. 14 Jan. 2010.

Personal Interview

Last name, first name (of person being interviewed). Type of interview (personal, telephone, e-mail). Date of interview.

Perdue, Beverly. Personal interview. 21 Oct. 2009.

Art Online

Artist's last name, first name. Title of work (italicized). Date of creation. Institution and city where work is housed (if known).

Title of web site (italicized). Medium of publication. Date accessed.

Klee, Paul. *Twittering Machine*. 1922. Museum of Modern Art, New York. *The Artchive*. Web. 22 May 2006.

Image or Photograph Online

Photographer's or creator's last name, first name (if known). Name of subject or title of the photograph (italicized). Date created.

Web site name (italicized). Publication medium. Date accessed.

Smith, John. *Sunset on the Atlantic*. 2000. *CNN.com*. Web. 1 Feb. 2010.

Online Video Clip

Author's last name, first name (if given). "Title of video clip." Title of web site (italicized). Sponsor of web site, Date of publication or last update. Publication medium. Date accessed.

Murphy, Beth. "Tips for a Good Profile Piece." *Project: Report*. YouTube, 17 Sept. 2008. Web. 19 Sept. 2008.

Print Sources

Book – one author

Author's last name, first name. Title of book (italicized). Place of publication: Publisher, Date published. Publication Medium.

McGinley, Phyllis. *The Province of the Heart*. New York: The Viking Press, 1959. Print.

Book – two authors

Author's last name, first name and first and last name of second author. Title of book (italicized). Place of publication: Publisher, Date published. Medium.

Jewett, Frances L., and Clare McCausland. *Plant Hunters*. Boston: Houghton Mifflin, 1958. Print.

Book – compiled by an editor

Editor's last name, first name, **ed**. Title of book (italicized). Place of publication: Publisher, Date published. Publication medium.

Gunn, Giles, ed. *Literature and Religion*. New York: Harper, 1971. Print.

General Encyclopedia or Dictionary entry

Author's last name, first name (if given). "Title of Article." Name of encyclopedia (italicized). Edition number (if given).

Year published. Publication medium.

"Egypt." *New Encyclopaedia Britannica*. 15th ed. 2007. Print.

Work in an anthology or section/chapter of a book

Author of the selection's last name, first name. "Title of the selection." Title of the book (italicized). Ed. Editor's first name, last name. Place of publication: Publisher, Date published. Publication medium.

Halliday, E.M. "Hemingway's Ambiguity: Symbol and Irony." *Hemingway*. Ed. Robert P. Weeks. Englewood Cliffs: Prentice Hall, 1962. Print.

Government publication

Name of the government. Name of department or agency. Title of the publication (italicized). Place of publication: Publisher, Date published. Publication medium.

United States. Dept. of Labor. *Child Care: A Workforce Issue*. Washington: GPO, 1988. Print.
